## Specialist Sports' funding – end of year review July 2023

The government is continuing to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The government's aim in providing this funding is to ensure the health, enjoyment and wellbeing of the children. The money can only be spent on improving the quality of the schools PE and sports provision.

73% of Y6 children leaving Astbury in July 2023 achieved the following:

- use a range of strokes effectively
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

## What we will spend our funding on this school year 2023 – 2024.

We will continue to fund Amaven to further develop the PE curriculum and assessment throughout school and support staff in their delivery of PE. We will also buy into the Education and Community Partnership to give our children access to a range of tournaments and competitions locally. In addition this year, part of our funding will be spent on employing a KICK coach to deliver a sports afterschool club and promote sport through mentoring.
